

To be eligible for energy assistance, a household income must be at or below 80 percent of Oregon’s median income. See the table below. Income levels are based on household income and household size.

Households may rent or own their property. Rental/utility agreements and landlord cooperation may affect the kind or level of benefits provided. A household must also have documented energy costs.
