Residential Housing Rehabilitation GRANT PROGRAM

The homeowner rehabilitation assistance program provides funds to income-eligible owneroccupants to assist with repair, and rehabilitation to their homes.



<u>What is the Residential</u> <u>Rehabilitation Housing Program?</u>

- New funds give preference to homeowners within specified areas. This fund provides nonrepayable grants to low and moderate income homeowners to repair their owner occupied homes.
- The money must be used to pay for necessary, eligible home repairs. And contracted with a licensed, bonded contractor listed with the Contractors Board of Oregon.

Eligible Repairs not limited to:

- Roofing
- Insulation
- Accessibility improvements
- Plumbing
- Electrical repair/replacement
- Energy Efficiency
- Weatherization
- Heating systems, furnace, Hot water heaters
- Exterior doors and windows

Who is Eligible?

A qualified applicant must:

- Be the owner of the home AND land
- Own a mobile home 1977 or newer, located in a mobile home park
- Live in the home as their primary residence
- Meet other eligibility requirements
- Low–moderate household income:

1 Person	\$45,300
2 People	\$51,800
3 People	\$58,250
4 People	\$64,700
5 People	\$69,900
6 People	\$75,100

How does the program work?

- Homeowners complete a wait list form
- When funding becomes available, interested residents are asked to complete an application process
- Eligible applicants are served in order of receipt and based upon program priorities and guidelines

<u>Community in Action (CinA) is here</u> to HELP each step of the way

CinA helps homeowners:

- Complete the necessary paper work.
- A HUD Quality Standard Inspection is done in your home. A housing rehabilitation representative will work with you to create a list of eligible repairs.
- Find a contractor. CinA provides you with a list of licensed contractors and a bid document for you to give to them listing the needed repairs
- Close the deal. CinA will prepare and process the necessary construction documents.
- Make sure the project gets completed. CinA checks on the progress being made to ensure it is completed in a timely and satisfactory manner.
- Pay the bills. CinA will issue payment to contractors on your behalf as the work is completed.
